She returned to Natchez in 2001 and opened the Twin Oaks Bed and Breakfast in a historic antebellum home dating to 1832, where she teaches cooking classes as well as serves as a warm, ebullient host. Her latest venture is King's Tavern in Natchez, specializing in fresh farm-to-table selections. Under her deft touch, the dining experience on the *Louisiane* is elevated to an apogee of gastronomic pleasure.

PANACHE and COMFORT

"A meal is a celebration," she claims. "It is a time when we gather together at one table and celebrate family and friends, both old and new, with love and laughter. The cuisine should both embrace and lift the spirit."

She blends the panache of French cuisine with the comfort of Southern staples. "The French have a natural ability to acknowledge each flavor, each spice and each cooking method in a manner that brings them together in a harmonious symphony. Southern cuisine does the same in a straightforward way that celebrates regional ingredients blending myriad cultural and agricultural influences," she says. Regina is proud to encompass both styles in her menus as she brings the regions in which the *Louisiane* sails directly to the plate. Much of the American South was deeply influenced by the French and so is French America Line's elegant but wonderfully familiar cuisine.





PREVIEW the FLAVORS

CHEF REGINA'S RECIPE REVEALED

CRÊPES SUZETTE

SERVES 8

CRÊPE INGREDIENTS

2 large eggs

1/2 cup milk

1/8 teaspoon salt

1 cup all-purpose flour

2 tablespoons salted butter, melted

Vegetable oil spray

SAUCE INGREDIENTS

3/4 cup sugar

1 tablespoon finely grated orange zest

1/4 cup (1/2 stick) salted butter

1/4 cup Grand Marnier® or other orange-flavored liqueur

DIRECTIONS

Whisk the eggs in a bowl. Add the milk, 1/2 cup water, and the salt and whisk to combine. Slowly whisk in the flour and the melted butter to make a smooth, thin batter. Let batter rest for 10 minutes before using.

Heat a 6-inch crêpe pan or nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. When the pan is hot, lightly coat with the vegetable spray. Ladle about 1/4 cup of the batter into the pan, tilting it to coat evenly with batter. Cook until the crêpe is golden brown on the bottom and the top is set, about 1 minute. Using a rubber spatula, flip the crêpe. Cook on the second side until light brown and set, about 30 seconds. Transfer to a plate. Repeat with the remaining batter, separating the cooked crêpes with sheets of wax paper. (The crêpes can be made up to 2 hours ahead and kept at room temperature.)

To make the sauce, combine the sugar and orange zest in a bowl. Let sit for 1 hour so that the zest can impart an orange flavor to the sugar.

Melt the butter in a large skillet over low heat, being careful not to let it brown. Add the orange sugar and cook, stirring constantly with a wooden spoon, until the sugar dissolves completely, about 2 minutes.

Fold eight crêpes (the best ones, if you've made more) into quarters and place them in the skillet over medium heat, stirring to coat each evenly with the sauce. Carefully add the Grand Marnier[®] and, using a long-handled lighter, ignite the contents. Stand away from the stove for a few seconds and let the flames die down. Turn off the burner. Place one crêpe on each of eight dessert plates and serve immediately.

SOPHISTICATED, CHARMING AND SURPRISING PORTS OF CALL

ALEXANDRIA, LA | Reflect on the tumultuous history of the region here in the exact geographical center of Louisiana by visiting Kent Plantation House, a classic example of French Colonial architecture featuring enlightening tours of both house and grounds.

BATON ROUGE, LA | Tour the exceptional and fascinating Rural Life Museum with its extensive collection of 19th and early 20th century artifacts and buildings, before heading into the proud and lively Louisiana state capital. Take time at the new and old State Capitols, both handsome and striking edifices in their own right.

at the Beardstown Courthouse, where a young lawyer named Abraham Lincoln once practiced law and which was the site of a famed Lincoln-Douglas debate in 1858, then ponder the town's importance during the Black Hawk War of 1832.

CAPE GIRARDEAU, MO | Engage with history at this battle site where Union and Confederate soldiers clashed in a fierce barrage of artillery. Study the illuminating murals peppering the town, and visit the lovingly restored Glenn House, a reminder of a more genteel time.

CAVE-IN-ROCK, IL | You're sure to find this sleepy little village's 19th century swashbuckling past rather intriguing. From their base in a natural cave along the river, armed river pirates used to hide where they could easily row out and rob passing steamboats.

Chattanooga, graced by nature with remarkable vistas including a view of seven states from atop towering Lookout Mountain, home to the Chickamauga & Chattanooga National Military Park, and stroll to the world-class Hunter Museum of American Art across the wrought-iron Walnut Street Bridge, the world's longest pedestrian bridge.



CHESTER, IL | Get tickled by the Popeye Museum and the beloved sailor's statue, found here in the hometown of his creator, E. C. Segar. Journey to Ste. Genevieve and admire the lovingly preserved French Colonial architecture.

CINCINNATI, OH | Be part of enduring tradition as you arrive by river to the town Longfellow dubbed "Queen City of the West", and indulge in sophisticated sightseeing at the art deco Union Terminal, the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center, and much more.

CLARKSVILLE, TN | Alight in Tennessee's first incorporated city, named after General George Rogers Clark, brother of William (of Lewis & Clark fame). Step back in time at Fort Defiance Civil War Park and its Interpretive Center, a must-see stop for history buffs.

DAVENPORT, IA | Appreciate the exploding cultural scene at this city founded on the site of the 1832 Black Hawk purchase, as well as surrounding attractions such as the excellent Figge Art Museum, Rock Island Arsenal, and the John Deere Historic Site.

DECATUR, AL | Take flight at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center at NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center, featuring exhibits and artifacts detailing the dramatic history of America's space exploration, an extensive collection of rockets deemed "the finest in the world" by legendary astronaut John Glenn, and even g-force simulators for the boldest among you.

DOVER, TN | Surrender to the charm of Dover, unlike Confederate officer Nathan Bedford Forrest, who refused to give up his cavalry after a resounding Union victory. Wander through the park honoring Forrest, and revisit his exploits at Fort Donelson National Battlefield.

DUBUQUE, IA/GALENA, IL | Build up your knowledge of Dubuque's early river commerce at the intriguing Smithsonian-affiliated Mississippi River Museum, and take a journey to the Ulysses S. Grant home and Blaum Bros. Distillery in Galena.

The Miracle Worker" Anne Sullivan saved the young girl from a life of darkness, and step into a rich musical legacy at FAME recording studios, where luminaries such as Aretha Franklin, Otis Redding, and The Osmonds laid down iconic tracks.

GRAFTON, IL | Check out the charming Grafton Historic District, one of several areas and buildings on the national Register of Historic Places, shop for handcrafted gifts or tour a local winery. Keep a sharp lookout and you just might see one of the area's bald eagles soar through the sky.









GREENVILLE, MS | Delve into the shrouded past at Winterville Mounds, an archaeological site that offers a rare look into the lives of early American peoples. Grasp how the Mississippi Delta played a key role for natives centuries before Europeans stumbled upon it.

HANNIBAL, MO | Pay tribute to Samuel Clemens, better known as Mark Twain, at his Boyhood Home and Museum in this welcoming town. Reenact Tom and Huck's exploits if you're feeling mischievous, as Hannibal provided the setting for their quintessentially American adventures.

HAVANA, IL | Grab your binoculars and go bird-watching at Emiquon National Wildlife Refuge, discover Native American culture at the nearby Dickson Mounds State Museum, or head a bit farther down the road to Springfield's Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum.

HELENA, AR | You're sure to agree with Mark Twain's assessment that Helena "occupies one of the prettiest situations on the Mississippi," but there's more than just looks to this hub of blues music, which features the lovingly reconstructed Civil War-era Fort Curtis.

HENDERSON, KY | Seek inspiration in Henderson, as did both the unequaled naturalist John James Audubon and blues legend W. C. Handy. Visit the John James Audubon Museum, which displays the world's largest collection of Audubon art and artifacts.

HOUMAS HOUSE, LA | Be enchanted by this prosperous antebellum plantation estate and its inviting gardens, a wildly popular site for dream weddings, and also the setting for the riveting Olivia de Havilland and Bette Davis movie *Hush...Hush*, *Sweet Charlotte*.

LA CROSSE, WI | Survey three states atop towering Grandad Bluff, then discover the creative talents of the locals at the Pump House Regional Arts Center. And no visit is complete without a snapshot of the World's Largest Six Pack.

LOUISVILLE, KY | Discover captivating Louisville, named after King Louis XVI of France, as you sip a mint julep and stroll the waterfront. Be sure to head to the Louisville Slugger Museum and Factory, Churchill Downs or learn about a boxing legend at the Muhammad Ali Center.

MADISON, IN | Stroll among the numerous buildings on the National Register of Historic Places nestled in this scenic valley village, and relax in the natural wonders offered up by beautiful Clifty Falls State Park just outside of town.





MARIETTA, OH | Recall George Washington's musing that he knew "no other country where I should rather fix my habitation" when you visit idyllic Marietta, the site of Ohio's first settlement as memorialized at the history-rich Campus Martius Museum.

MAYSVILLE, KY | Absorb the history of picturesque Maysville through the stunning large-scale murals painted against the downtown floodwall, and delight in the meticulously constructed miniature replica dwellings found at the Kentucky Gateway Museum Center.

MEMPHIS, TN | Take in the sounds of Memphis, where a stroll on soulful Beale Street, a tour of Graceland, or a visit to the Stax Museum of Soul Music and the Rock 'n' Soul Museum will have you feeling the beat.

NATCHEZ, MS | Get lost among over 500 gallant antebellum buildings in this magnificent town, one of America's most historically significant national treasures. Chat up the friendly locals in the thriving entertainment district Natchez-Under-the-Hill, which Mark Twain once described as having a "desperate reputation, morally."

NATCHITOCHES, LA | Relish the European and Creole flavors of the oldest settlement in Louisiana, where a vast array of landmarks await, which include the Kaffie-Frederick Mercantile Store, the oldest general store in Louisiana, and the *Steel Magnolias* movie filming sites.

NEW MADRID, MO | Imagine this sleepy village flattened in 1811 by North America's strongest recorded earthquake, and later further shaken up by 1862's Battle of Island Number Ten. Artifacts are on view at the quaint Historical Museum and the Hunter-Dawson State Historic Site.

NEW ORLEANS, LA | Amble along the festive streets of the "Big Easy", where the scent of Creole dishes and the strains of jazz mingle within stately French Quarter homes, and hop on a streetcar to further uncover this most European of American cities.

OAK ALLEY, LA | Linger at one of the most photogenic sites in America, majestic Oak Alley Plantation, and stroll its allée, lined by 28 massive oaks more than 300 years old. Tour the Big House and investigate the buildings dotting the lovely grounds.

NEW OTTAWA, IL | Located at the spot where the Fox River meets the last navigable portion of the Illinois River, this town sits just 90 miles from Chicago. Understand the struggles of slaves with a tour of the John Hossack House, a critical station on the Underground Railroad that ushered tens of thousands of souls to freedom.





PADUCAH, KY | Picture 42,000 Union soldiers boarding 185 ships on their way upriver, and you'll get a sense of the rich local history that is captured at the Floodwall Murals. See the Wacinton Sculpture honoring the Chickasaw Indians and tour the enchanting National Quilt Museum.

Riverfront Museum just a few steps from the *Louisiane*, check out the enormous and sophisticated equipment at the exceptional Caterpillar Visitor Center, and inhale the sweet fragrance of the Luthy Botanical Garden's colorful blooms.

NEW PERU, IL | Stroll the quaint streets of this town which was once an important steamboat hub and also a center for the manufacture of alarm clocks for nearly a century. Take a hike along one of the trails in Baker Lake Park and listen for a summer band concert in Centennial Park.

PINE BLUFF, AR | Delight in the rare vintage steam engines found at the Arkansas Railroad Museum here in amiable Pine Bluff, then browse the Civil War and WWII artifacts at the Jefferson County Historical Museum or experience the bounty of the Arkansas River at the Delta Rivers Nature Center.

PITTSBURGH, PA | Enjoy the sweeping city vistas from up high on Mount Washington, then mingle with other high flyers at the riotous National Aviary. Become transported by the kaleidoscopic stained glass at Heinz Memorial Chapel, mere minutes away from esteemed Carnegie Mellon University.

PRAIRIE DU CHIEN, WI | Contemplate 10,000 years of Native American history at this once bustling fur-trading center, now host to five National Historic Landmarks, including the Victorian stunner Villa Louis. Locals insist you stop by Valley Fish and Cheese for their mouthwatering victuals.





RED WING, MN | Find out why the National Trust for Historic Preservation noted picturesque Red Wing as a distinctive destination for its "impressive architecture and enviable natural environment." And don't leave town without a pair of its eponymous shoes.

WINONA, MN | Be awed by lofty Sugar Loaf, one of the most recognizable topographical landmarks along Minnesota's bluff country. Find further inspiration at the Minnesota Marine Art Museum, which features one of the two original versions of Leutze's *Washington Crossing the Delaware*.

ST. LOUIS, MO | Wonder at the St. Louis Arch, an unequaled architectural statement that defines this storied town, then continue your architectural tour at the imposing Cathedral of St. Louis. Indulge a less lofty American pastime at the Anheuser-Busch brewery, an American classic.

ST. PAUL, MN | Admire the Cathedral of St. Paul, a beaux-arts wonder that emulates St. Peter's in Rome, and soak in the arts at the city's world-class museums, including the Walker Art Center. Detour to Minnehaha Falls, best known for Longfellow's Song of Hiawatha.

SAVANNAH/SHILOH, TN | Commemorate one of the most legendary Civil War battles at Shiloh Battlefield, where more than 111,000 Union and Confederate soldiers clashed and casualties reached nearly 24,000.

SHREVEPORT, LA | Marvel at mankind's ingenuity at the Barksdale Global Power Museum, home to an impressive collection of military aircraft, and the Shreveport Water Works Museum, showcasing a century of water extraction through innovative engineering. Don't overlook the lively casino scene.

VICKSBURG, MS | Hear the distant echoes of Ulysses S. Grant's call to arms as he lay a 47-day siege to the city, now immortalized at the Vicksburg National Military Park, which houses the ironclad *USS Cairo*.

WELLSBURG, WV | Breathe in the fresh air at this peaceful hamlet and its charming Brook Hill Park, or take a quick jaunt to Fort Steuben in nearby Steubenville, OH, a fully-reconstructed 18th century fort.

DEPOSIT/FINAL PAYMENT

To reserve your cruise, a AUD\$600 per person deposit is required at the time of booking. Optional Pre- or Post-Cruise Extension Programs require a AUD\$250 per person deposit at the time of booking. Full payment is due no later than 60 days prior to departure. Passengers will not be permitted to change travel agents once final payment has been received by French America Line. Final documentation will be issued after receipt of final payment and approximately 30 days prior to sailing. All reservations are subject to cancellation if payments are not received by the due date, and are guaranteed only when paid in full 60 days prior to sailing.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

Should you find it necessary to cancel your reservation or any component thereof, you are required to contact your Cruiseco Travel Agent directly by telephone as well as submit your cancellation in writing.

If your cancellation request is received more than 60 days prior to your initial sailing date, a AUD\$600 per person non-refundable administrative fee will be charged per booking. This administrative fee may not be converted to a future cruise credit.

Cancellation requests received within 60 days of the initial sailing date will be subject to the following charges, regardless of resale and may not be converted to cruise credit: 59 days up to and including the initial sailing date or nonappearance at the time of sailing, 100% per person penalty of the cruise fare.

LOST PROPERTY

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

All travel documents are the passenger's responsibility. It is also the passenger's responsibility to obtain any necessary visas (non US-citizens). Without the required documents, a passenger may be denied boarding and accommodation by French America Line or the passenger may be disembarked during the voyage and French America Line will not make a refund or be otherwise liable to any passenger for such denial of boarding or disembarkation.
